DO'S AND DONT'S For Safe Flights

Uncrewed Aircraft Systems Florida State Statutes

- **330.41 Unmanned Aircraft Systems Act.**
- **330.04 Possession of pilot's license; inspection on demand.**
- **329.10 Aircraft registration.**
- **934.50 Searches and seizure using a drone.**

- Do's**
- Register your drone with it clearly marked on the outside of the aircraft.
 - Obtain authorization before flying in controlled airspace. (You are now in **Class C**).
 - Consult with B4UFLY app for verification of flight restriction in your area.
 - Keep drone in visual line of sight at ALL times.
 - Give right-of-way to all crewed aircraft or First Responders utilizing drones.

- Dont's**
- Fly more than 400ft or what is regulated by LAANC in your area.
 - Interfere with crewed aircrafts.
 - Fly over any person or moving vehicle.
 - Interfere with emergency response activities.
 - Fly under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
 - Operate your drone in a careless or reckless manner.


