Visit Downtown Farmers' Market

Residents can purchase farm-fresh produce and vegetables at the Downtown Farmers' Market every Saturday morning. The market is open from 7 a.m. to noon and is located on Magnolia Avenue between Beach Street and Palmetto Avenue. Residents enrolled in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program can use their benefits at the farmers' market. Market goers must stay six feet away from others, point at items to purchase (cannot touch) and wear masks and disposable gloves.
