Southern portion of Sweetheart Trail complete

More sections of the city's Sweetheart Trail have been constructed and are open for public use – from Bellevue Avenue to Orange Avenue. This completes the southern portion of the trail, which ends at the city limits at Beville Road. The four-mile Sweetheart Trail, a 12-foot wide, concrete, multi-use trail along the Halifax River, is complete with the exception of Orange Avenue to Bay Street, which is under construction as part of the Riverfront Park transformation.
