
### Dolly Parton's Imagination Library Program

## New procedure to help with traffic during large events

People who live or work on the beachside in Daytona Beach are encouraged to pick up a pink pass from the Daytona Beach Police Department, which has reinstated a public safety procedure for when traffic backs up during large special events. The Police Department is issuing pink passes to people who live or work on the beachside so that if the bridges are backed up during large special events, motorists with passes will still be able to access their homes or places of employment via the Main Street Bridge.

Passes can be picked up 24/7 from the Police Department Headquarters at 129 Valor Blvd. or from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. at the Police Department's Beachside Precinct at 510 Harvey Ave. Persons receiving a pass will need to show proof of beachside residency or employment.
