
Permit and inspection fees waived

Building permit and inspection fees continue to be waived for commercial and residential properties within the borders of Mason Avenue to Shady Place and Nova Road to Ridgewood Avenue. Eligible projects include, but are not limited to, renovating interiors, replacing or repairing a roof, adding fencing, improving or adding a driveway and adding windows or doors. City redistricting underway

The city is in the process of redistricting based on the results of the 2020 Census, which reflected that Daytona Beach's official population is 72,647, a 19% increase since the previous count. Every 10 years, cities use newly released census data to redraw district lines to adjust for population shifts so each district is substantially equal in population.
