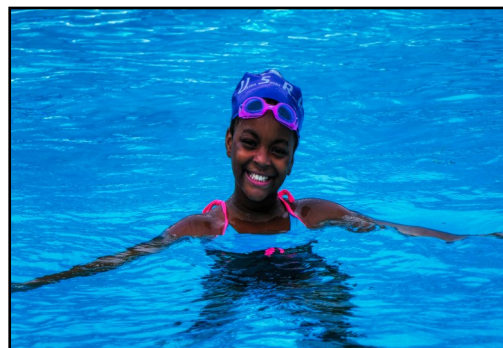
Register youth for swim lessons
