## New playground at Colin's Park

A new playground is being installed at Colin's Park, a riverfront multiuse green space at 100 University Blvd. Designed for children ages 2 to 12, the new playground offers a wide range of fitness activities including climbing, riding, spinning and swinging, with several pieces having ADA access. Installation should be completed in two weeks.

The playground equipment is part of a series of improvements to the park, which was built in 1996 in memory of Colin Every, a toddler who drowned in 1994. It was the first beachside children's park built specifically for their use.

Sidewalks have also installed and upgraded landscaping is planned. The project is partially funded by a \$53,125 grant from the Daytona Beach Racing and Recreational Facilities District.
