Residents can safely dispose of unwanted items during the city's annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 5, at the city's Public Works Facility at 950 Bellevue Ave. Materials not accepted include fuel, gas cans, tires or lawn equipment (mowers, trimmers or gas-powered yard maintenance items). Motor oil collection sites

Used motor oil is a major contaminant of waterways so it should never be dumped down drains or put in the trash. One gallon of motor oil can contaminate one million gallons of fresh water. The city has made it easy and convenient for residents to dispose of used oil for FREE at collection centers throughout the city. In addition to used motor oil, other oils like transmission fluid, gear oil, lubricating oil, etc. can be poured directly into the receptacles.
