


Building permit fees waived for storm repairs

The City of Daytona Beach is waiving building permit fees through Monday, Dec. 5, for work to repair or restore damage caused by Hurricane Ian. Waivers apply to commercial and residential properties within city limits. Examples of permit types:

- A/C and water heater replacement
- Docks
- Electrical repairs and replacement
- Fences
- Roofing
- Screen enclosures
- Sheds
- Soffit/fascia/siding repair or replacement
- Window and door replacement

Kelly Field recognized with historical marker


The former site where Jackie Robinson practiced in Daytona Beach was recognized with a permanent historical marker at the city's Midtown Cultural & Educational Center at 925 George W. Engram Blvd. Known as Kelly Field in Cypress Street Park, which was near the corner of George W. Engram Boulevard and Keech Street, the field was recognized with a marker, which was unveiled at a ceremony in October and made possible through the Florida Historical Marker Program, a part of the Florida Division of Historical Resources.



City completes improvements at Colin's Park

The city recently completed a series of improvements to Colin's Park, which is the only riverfront park on beachside. The 2.5-acre, family-friendly park has new playground equipment and terrain, landscaping enhancements, a repainted pavilion, and the sidewalks have been repaired. The park also has picnic tables, a walking trail and a pier.

The \$215,000 improvements were funded in part by a grant from the Daytona Beach Racing & Recreational Facilities District. Colin's Park was founded through a private/public partnership in memory of Colin Every, a toddler who died in a drowning accident in 1994. Colin's Park is at 100 University Blvd. and is open from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. April through November and 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. December through March.
