## Citywide road resurfacing program resumes next month

*Maintenance prevents further decline and increases longevity*

The city will continue to invest in maintaining, rehabilitating and repaving neighborhood streets in the new year.

Roadway maintenance is funded at \$4.1 million with nearly 36 lane miles scheduled for milling, resurfacing and striping. There are eight phases in the upcoming schedule.

In addition to residential streets being improved, Daytona Stadium's parking lot is scheduled for a pavement overlay to ensure public safety and accessibility.

In the past two years, 70 lane miles of neighborhood streets have been resurfaced through the citywide Road Resurfacing and Restoration Program.

Work will resume next month in the Executive Circle area and Indigo Lakes Golf Club subdivision.

Residents and businesses will be notified via doorhangers and electronic message boards in advance of work beginning. Crews generally work 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Friday, and there may be temporary lane/road closures during paving operations.

Throughout 2023, neighborhood streets in the Madison Heights, Fairway Estates and LPGA International subdivisions will be resurfaced. Select streets on the beachside and in the area east of Nova Road and north of Mason Avenue are also planned to be improved.

### How streets are selected

City staff evaluated the condition of the city's roadways using the Pavement Surface & Rating (PASER) system in 2020.

The 10-point rating system (one is the worst score and 10 is the best) is widely used by communities and road agencies across the country. A roadway's rating determines what type of maintenance is required, minimal or extensive.

Most of the city's roads rated as a 5 or "fair" condition. The condition of the roads selected in this year's work plan are rated between a 4 and 5, with some, which need more extensive work, as a 2 and 3.

Rating	Condition	Maintenance Category
1-3	Poor	Reconstruction
4-5	Fair	Resurfacing
6-10	Good	Routine Maintenance
