

Summer camp registration opens May 1

Registration is first come, first served at City Hall, 301 S. Ridgewood Ave., in the Parks & Recreation office on the first floor. Office hours are 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. Appointments are not required to register youth and the registration fee has been waived for this year. The cost for the summer camp is \$270 per youth and there is a 10% discount for siblings. 


Annual fire hydrant maintenance underway

Testing is underway on the city's 2,724 fire hydrants. Each hydrant will be tested as part of a citywide annual maintenance program to ensure servable hydrants are fully functional. Hydromax USA is the company performing the annual maintenance and will be easily recognizable in uniforms and marked vehicles. Crews will work from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, weather permitting. Testing is scheduled to be completed by Sept. 30. For more information, call (386) 671-8815.

Permit and inspection fees continue to be waived

To promote neighborhood improvement and beautification, as well as to spur private investment in the core of the city, building permit and inspection fees are waived for commercial and residential properties within the borders of Mason Avenue to Shady Place and Nova Road to Ridgewood Avenue through Oct. 20. Eligible projects include, but are not limited to, interior renovations, replacing or repairing a roof, adding fencing, improving or adding a driveway and adding windows or doors. Ineligible projects include, but are not limited to, building a new structure separate from an existing building or any new single-family home. Completed permit applications are available at www.CODb.us and can also be picked up at the Permits and Licensing office at City Hall, 301 S.
