




## Florida Tennis Center hosts summer camp for youth

Registration is first come, first served and will open Monday, May 1, at City Hall (301 S. Ridgewood Ave.) in the Parks & Recreation office on the first floor. Office hours are 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. Appointments are not required to register youth, and the registration fee has been waived for this year. The cost for the summer camp is \$270 per youth and there is a 10% discount for siblings. A weekly payment plan of \$30 per week is available. For more information, call (386) 671-8250.
