Renderings reveal a mid-century modern design with a wave-inspired roof, bold red accents, ample floor-to-ceiling windows and exposed steel supports. The headquarters, which will be built on a 3.6-acre site on South Ridgewood Avenue, will replace the nearly 100-year-old historic facility on South Beach Street. Construction is expected to begin this summer, and completion is projected for late 2025.
