

## Daytona Highlands neighborhood turns 100 years old

The area's oldest subdivision is celebrating its 100th anniversary. The Daytona Highlands, located near the southwest corner of the International Speedway Boulevard and Nova Road intersection, was created in 1924 during Florida's land boom. The developer, Wayne Gilman, created the impressive coquina entrance, called the Tarragona Arch or Tarragona Tower, to show investors it wasn't a scam like a lot of other Florida developments at the time. Half of the storied arch remains on International Speedway Boulevard, across from Daytona State College.

Residents in the Daytona Highlands neighborhood, which has about 200 homes, will host a public reception to celebrate the neighborhood's 100th anniversary with the support of Zone 6 City Commissioner Paula R. Reed.

## FDOT's Nova Canal clearing project reaches Daytona Beach

The Florida Department of Transportation is dredging the state-owned Nova Canal to remove silt, debris, vegetation and muck. "We haven't had a project in the Nova Canal of this scale in recent memory," said FDOT Project Manager Alexander MacKey. Using historic plans from the mid-1970s, the \$875,000 project will restore the canal's original depth and width. The entire project will cover a 7.5-mile stretch from Port Orange to Holly Hill and is expected to be completed late this year.
