

### Tiger Dam used during Hurricane Milton

For the first time, the city deployed a Tiger Dam, a water-filled inflatable barrier, to hold back floodwaters from its Bethune Point Wastewater Treatment Plant along the Halifax River. The Florida Division of Emergency Management provided the Tiger Dam, as well as 10 generators and four bypass pumps. The dam worked to prevent rising river levels from entering the treatment plant.
