SUNNYLAND PRESS BOX TOWER

Work is underway on Sunnyland's press box tower. Crews are extending utilities and finished forming the foundation. They have started pouring footings this week, and concrete block walls will be laid next week. The new press box is significantly larger and will be repositioned behind the home plate, correcting the previous misalignment. Additionally, the first floor of the press tower will feature a concession stand and a storage room. **The two-story tower is anticipated to be finished within two months.**
