

Daytona Beach schools help propel Volusia County to historic "A" rating

In a landmark achievement for education in our community, Volusia County Schools earned an overall "A" grade from the Florida Department of Education for the first time since 2008-09, marking a major milestone in student success and community progress. Daytona Beach schools played a pivotal role in this historic accomplishment, with both Mainland and Seabreeze high schools receiving "A" ratings, a first-ever for Mainland. In addition, Beachside Elementary earned its first "A" rating since Ortona and Osceola Elementary Schools merged into one school.
