

City will no longer issue pennies as change

Due to the ongoing nationwide shortage of one-cent coins, the City of Daytona Beach is updating its process for handling cash utility payments to ensure residents can continue making payments smoothly, even when exact change is not available. This adjustment is necessary because TD Bank, the city's financial institution, will no longer fulfill requests for pennies. The rounding-and-credit approach is designed to be transparent and straightforward for residents while reducing reliance on penny inventories.

How it will work:

When a customer pays a utility bill in cash, staff will round the payment up to the nearest five cents. Any amount above the exact bill total will be automatically applied as a credit on the customer's utility account and carried forward to the next billing cycle. (Customers may still pay with pennies; however, the city will not provide pennies as change.)

Example:

Amount due: \$102.33
Cash amount tendered: \$102.35
Credit applied to next month's bill: \$0.02

This procedure applies to cash utility payments and is intended to minimize inconvenience while maintaining consistent customer service.



New dog-friendly beach now open in Daytona Beach

Where it is:

The new dog-friendly area is between Williams Avenue and Seabreeze Boulevard. Access is convenient, with:

- Six vehicle ramps
- Nearly 300 off-beach parking spaces

Rules for visiting with your dog

To keep the beach clean and enjoyable for everyone, visitors must follow these guidelines:

- Dogs must be on a leash no longer than six feet at all times
- Owners must clean up after their dogs
- Dogs are not permitted in designated wildlife areas
- Dogs are allowed on the beach during daylight hours only

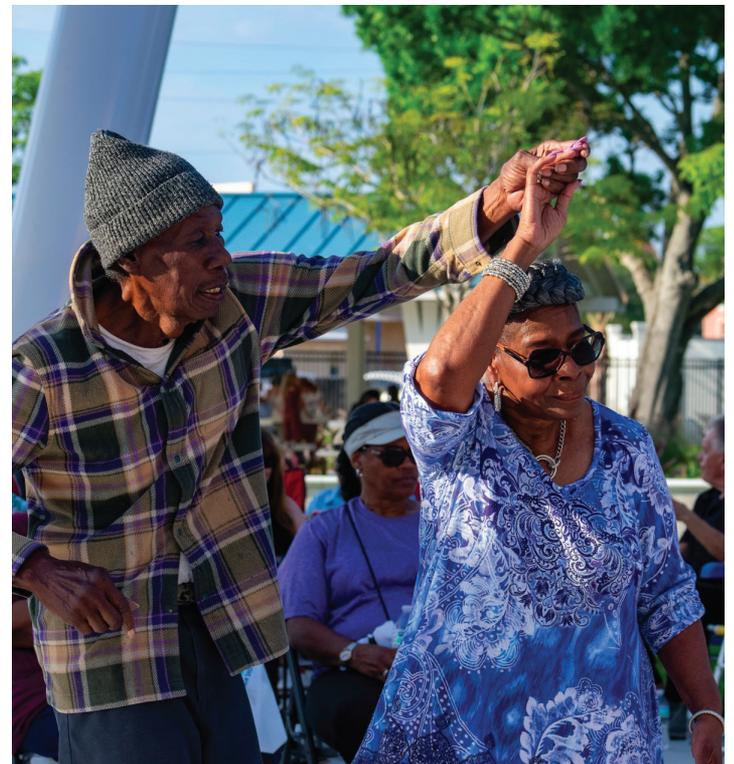
