

FINAL PUBLIC NOTICE

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has received the subgrant application for the City of Daytona Beach's Manatee Island Day Dock repairs due to damages in Hurricane Irma (DR-4337-FL PW 12300). Pursuant to Executive Order 11988 and 44 CFR Part 9.12, final notice is hereby given of FEMA's intent to provide funding for this project under the Public Assistance (PA) Program.

An initial disaster-wide Public Notice was published October 6, 2017 for Hurricane Irma. Comments and other information received were fully evaluated by FEMA along with evaluation of social, economic, environmental, and safety considerations. This notice serves as a project-specific final notice for FEMA's funding action located within the floodplain.

Funding for the proposed project will be conditional upon compliance with all applicable federal, tribal, state and local laws, regulations, floodplain standards, permit requirements and conditions. This action complies with the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) requirements.

- Floodplain:** Project is located in the AE Zone, per Volusia County FIRM Panel 12127C0357J dated 09/29/2017.
- Proposed Work and Purpose:** The City of Daytona Beach will Repair the Manatee Island wooden pier and aluminum ramp to restore this facility back to its pre-disaster design, function and capacity within the existing footprint. Repairs include the replacement of an aluminum truss ramp, replacement of 17 wooden pier piles, 14 wooden pile caps, 300 LF of treated lumber stringers, 480 SF of treated lumber decking, 840 LF of treated lumber railing spindles, 240 LF of treated lumber spindle plates, 120 LF of treated lumber hand rail top cap, 125 LF of treated lumber rail posts, and 75 LF of water hose.
- Project Alternatives:** Alternatives considered but dismissed were the no-action alternative and the relocation alternative. The no action alternative is not feasible as the repairs are necessary to ensure that the facility remains a safe and operational dock facility. With the no action alternative, continued negative impacts to the dock may be experienced, and the use of the facility for recreational purposes would be compromised. Relocation of the dock outside of the floodplain is not feasible as the dock is functionally dependent on its location in the floodplain.
