

FAQ

1. Who do I call with questions about garbage or recycling collection?

Call CODB Solid Waste 386-671-8670. If phones are busy, calls forward to Waste Pro USA.

2. How can I find my collection schedule?

3. How do I order a (replacement or repair) waste toter or recycling bin?

You can call CODB Solid Waste at 386-671-8670 or Waste Pro USA at 386-788-8890.

**Toters and bins are provided as a courtesy and are not owned by the Resident.

Please do not move them from the assigned property.

4. When do I place my containers out for collection?

Waste toters should be out by the curb by 7:00 a.m. on your service day. You may place them the night before if needed, after 6:00 p.m. Containers placed for curbside collection must be located curbside next to your driveway and not over 5 feet from the curb line or ten feet from the edge of the pavement.

Containers must be removed from curbside by 8:00 p.m. after service.

5. Does the City provide service for disabled Residents?

Yes. An application form for “back door service” (available on the CODB.us website under Solid Waste) must be signed by your Physician and submitted to CODB Solid Waste Services. The form can be submitted by mail, fax, or an emailed PDF attachment. Details are on the form.

6. What if I have more garbage than will fit in my waste toter?

Where the volume of garbage and trash generated exceeds the capacity of the containers provided, according to City Ordinance Chapter 78 Sec. 78-41 part 2:

If no container is available, you may place up to two (2) 30-gallon closed garbage bags next to your waste toter, the morning of service.

7. How do I request pick up for large appliances, furniture, and other “bulky” items?

Glass mirrors must be cardboarded and taped. Carpets must be cut, rolled, and taped in sections of no larger than 4' x 8' and weighing no more than 40 lbs. Residents may dispose of up to (8) car tires per year. Truck, tractor, or other tires are not accepted. These can be taken to Tomoka Landfill, Tomoka Farms Rd., Port Orange.

****Removal service for appliances containing coolants; refrigerators, freezers and AC units must be ordered separately. Doors must be removed for collection.**

8. What if I have construction and demolition debris or materials from a renovation project? Will this debris be collected curbside?

If the Resident has a self-worked small project, C & D materials may be placed into disposable containers, such as heavy waste bags or boxes. Containers must weigh no more than 40 lbs. each and must be removeable by hand. If the project is being done by a paid party or contractor; all waste must be disposed by them and will not be removed by CODB Solid Waste without a fee. ** City Ord. Chapter 78 Sec. 78-41, part a-2, **Preparation** and part c, **Special Service Charges**.

9. Yard Waste Collection

Yard waste should be placed curbside in front of the residence to be serviced. Do not place yard waste on adjacent vacant lots or neighboring properties. Trimmings resulting from ordinary yard care, including palm fronds, tree limbs not exceeding 5' in length or 6" in diameter may be placed for collection. (NOT in waste toters) Yard debris of hedge trimmings, weeds and leaves should be placed in bags. Bagged waste of up to 15 bags is acceptable. **Yard Waste collection is limited to 3 cubic yards.** Anything not properly prepared or over 3 cubic yard "piles" are subject to charged fees. Yard waste is collected 1 day per week on Wednesday. If a pile is not serviceable by the scheduled truck, a tag will be placed by Waste Pro USA advising it will be picked up by claw truck service OR it does not meet contracted requirements and may be charged.

The City of Daytona Beach waste contractor is not responsible for land clearing debris. This includes trees cut down or blown down on your property. You may order a special collection for removal and disposal. Items for special collection are charged.

10. Hazardous Waste

Includes, but is not limited to; car batteries, all automobile related liquids or parts, engine degreaser, metal cleaners, rechargeable batteries, lighter fluid, varnish, wood/cement sealers, paint and paint thinner, turpentine, acetone, acid, lye, fertilizers, pesticides, herbicides, fungicides, insect repellants, flea dip & sprays, rodent bait, rat poison, mothballs, fluorescent tubes, spiral and compact light bulbs, mercury thermometers or thermostats, pool or spa chemicals, bio-hazardous waste, sharps (needles), etc.

Please take these items – except for bio-hazardous waste – to the Household Hazardous Waste Site at the Tomoka Landfill, Tomoka Farms Rd.

Disposal of bio-hazardous waste can be coordinated with the Florida Dept. of Health-Volusia County.

****The City of Daytona hosts a "Hazardous Waste Amnesty Day" in November annually.**

Watch your utility bill for announcement. Items listed above except for bio-hazardous waste can be brought to CODB Public Works, 950 Bellevue Rd., Daytona Beach, 32114, on the scheduled day.

11. Recycling Services

Recycling is collected once per week; the day varies depending on location. A recycling bin is provided to residents as a courtesy. All items go into one bin. If more than one bin is needed, you may apply for one. Call CODB Solid Waste 386-671-8670.

Recycling within CODB is "single stream". All items are collected by a rear load truck, and the items are transported to a sorting facility. The City of Daytona Beach accepts all paper, such as newspaper (with the plastic sleeves removed), office paper, cardboard, telephone books, junk mail, magazines, and paper bags. Aluminum and steel cans, glass bottles (clear, green, and amber) Plastic bottles with recycle symbols 1-5.

Please note:

CODB Solid Waste does not provide move out, clean out or eviction waste removal services. This service may be ordered, and a fee charged. *However, if the pile is placed on the ROW, the city contractor can remove and charge.* The fee can be charged to a water utility account in the Property Owner's name.
