PART TIME OFFICER

All applicants shall successfully complete and possess state certification set forth by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement and shall undergo the same background and hiring protocols as full-time officers pursuant to FDLE employment standards and Departmental hiring guidelines.

The duties and assignments shall include traffic control, traffic posts, walking beats, crowd control, prisoner transport and processing activities plus working special events within the jurisdiction of the City.

Part Time Officers (P/T Officers) shall work a minimum of eight (8) hours per month or a total of ninety-six (96) hours per fiscal year.

P/T Officers shall be trained and deployed to perform normal patrol duty functions and only those administrative law enforcement duties to which they have received training.

Assignments to augment plain clothed or covert investigative duties with any Division or Unit shall be accompanied by a full-time sworn member.

SPECIAL EVENTS OFFICER

Special Events Officer applicants must be a United States citizen, eighteen (18) years of age, of good moral character with no felony convictions. They must also hold a valid driver's license and high school diploma or a G.E.D.

SEO's do not have law enforcement authority or powers to intervene in any matter unless summoned to assist by a sworn law enforcement officer.

SEOs shall be trained on the techniques of safe and efficient movement of pedestrian and vehicular traffic to be of assistance at special events or details and parades.

PRISONER TRANSPORT OFFICER

All qualified candidates selected for a position as a Transport Officer shall successfully complete and/or possess a law enforcement or correctional certification set forth by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement.

A Prisoner Transport Officer shall undergo the same background and hiring protocols as full-time sworn police officers pursuant to FDLE employment standards and Departmental hiring procedures.

CITIZENS ON PATROL

A Citizen on Patrol is a volunteer appointed by the Chief of Police.

Each volunteer applicant must complete a City of Daytona Beach application, be nineteen (19) years of age, successfully pass a background check and have a valid driver's license. Residency in Daytona Beach is not required.

CoPs are required to volunteer a minimum of eight (8) hours per month and/or 96 hours per year, whether participating in training or on patrol.

Training procedures consist of traffic control, radio usage, patrol procedures and vehicle operation.

INTERNSHIPS

An internship is an opportunity offered by the Daytona Beach Police Department to college students interested in law enforcement.

An internship can be an excellent option to experience a career while working only a few days or hours a week.

Internships offer students a hands-on opportunity to work in their desired field or area of expertise.
