SUBJECT: **2023 Enforcement Profiling / Biased Policing complaints**

DATE: January 31, 2024

Per Departmental Standards Directive for Personnel Complaints (1230.15), Biased Policing (500), and Accreditation Standard 2.06M, the yearly statistics for Enforcement Profiling / Biased Policing complaints have been compiled. The Office of Professional Standards received nine (9) complaints relating to Biased Policing in the 2023 calendar year. The complaints raised, related to profiling, racial and sexual discrimination, and harassment during traffic stops, subject stops, and responding to calls for service. The complaints were reviewed by the Office of Professional Standards, five (5) occurred from traffic stops, four (4) from other police contact. Of the nine (9) complaints, (4) traffic citations were issued, (2) subjects were arrested. Of all of the complaints none resulted in an internal investigation due to departmental policy violations. One officer was disciplined due to demeanor. Complainants felt that officers had no reason to have contacted them or they were wrongly stopped. All contact made with subject's by officers resulted in adherence to proper traffic stop procedures and sufficient reasons for the contact. During this period 6,265 traffic citations were issued (2,066 traffic citations were issued in 2022). Please see attached for field information and demographics for persons contacted (due to data entry and reporting, some numbers may vary).

In addition, the Office of Professional Standards conducted an annual review of agency practices involving bias profiling which included the areas of forfeitures and seizures. Department policies are up to date and conform to the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation along with I.A.C.P., and Florida State Statue standards. No deficiencies noted during this review.
